Champagnes

28. **Ayala Brut Majeur (France)** 35.00
An excellent Champagne and great value. This quality minded Champagne house was bought by Bollinger in 2005. It has a wonderfully fine mousse, is well balanced, has finesse and complexity. A great apéritif, it works well with seafood.
29. **Michel Arnould Brut Rosé (France)** 38.50
A gorgeous, rich rosé colour with typical Pinot fruit on the nose, wonderfully fresh with notes of red-berried fruit and cherries. The mousse is fine with lovely richness and well-balanced acidity. An excellent, full-flavoured rosé.
30. **Veuve Clicquot Brut Yellow Label (France)** 48.50
The full flavour of this champagne comes from good maturation. Soft, baked bread and biscuity nose, with creamy white fruits and a long lasting flavour. Stylish, elegant and full-bodied.

Sparkling Wines

31. **Prosecco, Vetriciano (Italy)** 17.95
An attractive biscuity nose leads onto a bright fruity palate with hints of pears and melon. An excellent aperitif on its own or with peach juice as a Bellini. Prosecco is the grape variety as well as the style of the wine.
32. **Tanners Cava Brut, Traditional Method (Spain)** 18.25
A superb, creamy, biscuity Cava with a lovely fine mousse and plenty of character. Made by the same method as champagne, it has style and finesse beyond its price.

White Wines

1. Pampas Chardonnay/Chenin, Mendoza (Argentina) 3.35 4.35 12.00
This has a lovely balance between the tropical, rounded Chardonnay and floral crispness from the Chenin Blanc grapes. drinking wine.
2. Ladera Verde Sauvignon, Central Valley (Chile) 3.35 4.35 12.50
Crisp and fresh with limey fruit, a hint of herbs and a twist of melon. Typically dependable and friendly, and an excellent introduction to Chile.
3. Ca Solare Pinot Grigio, Provincia di Pavia IGT (Italy) 3.60 4.60 13.00
With a crisp, dry, lightly floral character and a subtle honeyed note on the finish, this is a good example of Pinot Grigio, a white that has quickly become one of the most popular wines in Britain.
4. Wide River Viognier, Robertson (South Africa) 3.95 4.95 14.00
South Africa is producing some great examples of Viognier, and this is no exception. An intense nose of apricots and citrus is followed by orange peel flavours against a rich, silky background.
5. Picpoul de Pinet, Domaine des Lauriers, Coteaux du Languedoc (France) 16.50
Picpoul de Pinet is a very localised white grape growing just inland of the Mediterranean shore south of Montpellier. Marc Cabrol makes an atypical, rich and rounded style that still has the lemony balance required to match fish and oysters.
6. Tummil Flat Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough (New Zealand) 17.50
Classic Kiwi Sauvignon, fresh, crisp, full of gooseberry and nettle fruit with great poise and elegance.
7. Muscat d'Alsace R serve Particuli re, Henri Ehrhart (France) 18.00
This has all the hallmarks of Alsace. A nose that hints at grapey sweetness, but a dry palate that is delicately honeyed with lovely acidity.
8. House of Certain Views Unwooded Chardonnay, Hunter Valley (Australia) 19.50
This flavoursome white is made by Andrew and Lisa Margan from grapes sourced from contacts around the Hunter Valley. It is well balanced with fresh fruit. Andrew says the inspiration for the name came when he used to work in Bordeaux and passed Vieux Chateau Certain every day.
9. Chablis 'Le Classique', Pascal Bouchard (France) 26.25
A classic Chablis with freshness, minerality and good weight from an excellent producer. Pascal and Romain Bouchard make fresh, characterful wines in a modern winery from grapes both from their own domaine and bought in.
10. Pouilly-Fume, Jean Pabiot (France) 29.75
This estate combines the best of modern vinification techniques with the knowledge of 5 generations. This experience gives a wine with excellent fruit and classic flintiness from some of the best vineyards in Pouilly.

Ros  Wines

11. Amanti del Vino, Pinot Grigio Rosato, Veneto IGT (Italy) 3.50 4.50 12.75
Soft, easy Pinot Grigio Ros  with juicy red strawberry fruit. From near to Venice and ideal to drink by itself or with a meal.
12. Pato Torrente Cabernet Ros , Central Valley (Chile) 14.00
This is an off-dry, fruity ros , with plenty of strawberry flavours and lively, refreshing acidity. A good partner for many foods including Chinese and Oriental style dishes.

Red Wines

13. Pampas Shiraz/Malbec, Mendoza (Argentina) 3.35 4.35 12.00
A full, meaty wine with lots of spicy plum fruit and soft tannins providing the structure. Nice weight and good length in this perfect blend of Shiraz and Malbec.
14. Ladera Verde Merlot, Central Valley (Chile) 3.35 4.35 12.50
This has lovely plummy Merlot fruit with a ripeness that is so typical of Chile.
15. Alto Pampas del Sur Pinot Noir, Mendoza (Argentina) 3.35 4.35 12.50
This wine shows fine, very pure New World Pinot fruit with typical leafy, raspberry flavours and soft, ripe tannins.
16. Amanti del Vino Sangiovese, Rubicone IGT (Italy) 3.60 4.60 13.25
This has juicy, soft fruit with hints of black cherries and plums. Attractive, easy going wine from Emilia-Romagna.
17. Rioja Vega Tempranillo, Black Label (Spain) 14.25
A soft, fruity wine with plum and blackcurrant flavours, vibrant and juicy. This is a young (joven) wine without any oak, made to be drunk in its youth to appreciate its lively fruit.
18. Angel's Flight Red Zinfandel, California (USA) 16.50
Rich, ripe Zinfandel from California packed full with delicious raspberry, strawberry and blackberry fruit flavours. Soft tannins on the palate compliment the classic varietal character.
19. Zilzie Selection 23 Merlot, Victoria (Australia) 17.50
Shows striking aromas of plums and cherries mirrored by fruit on the palate, this is a squeaky clean, soft and juicy red.
20. Chateau du Grand Moulas, Cotes du Rhone, M. Ryckwaert (France) 18.50
Made near Orange at Mornas, this wine is ripe and flavoursome with depth of fruit and herby flavours. It is fresh, easy and very enjoyable now.
21. Karri Oak Estate Shiraz, Western Australia (Australia) 19.75
A stylish nose of black plum, dark berries, vanilla and spice. The palate is sweet and fleshy with more plum and blueberry fruit, richly textured with a fine finish.
22. Marques de Borba Tinto, Alentejo (Portugal) 20.00
This wine is made from local grape varieties. With ripe and rounded jammy fruit flavours, it is smooth with soft tannins.
23. Cousi o Macul Antiguas Reservas, Cabernet Sauvignon, Maipo (Chile) 21.00
Aged for one year in French oak with further ageing in bottle, the style here is quite classic having excellent ripe blackcurrant flavours with a good backbone. Good length too.
24. Fleurie, Domaine de la Virolette, J. Charlet (France) 22.00
Attractive, wild strawberry fruit is abundant in this wine making it a particularly juicy and good value example.
25. Instinct Pinot Noir, Kate Radburn, Martinborough (New Zealand) 25.00
A succulent fruit filled Pinot with both red and black fruit flavours. It has good body and well balanced acidity.
26. Vi a Salceda Reserva, Rioja (Spain) 27.50
An intense and complex wine full of ripe blackberry and blueberry fruit with hints of cassis, the initial fruit is followed by a subtle flavour of spices, cinnamon, vanilla and cloves. The finish is long and aromatic.
27. Chateau Montaignillon, Montagne-Saint-Emilion (France) 32.50
This has a delicious supple red fruit character of plums, blackcurrants and cherries backed up by good structure and ripe tannins.
